

Dr. Mohr earned a bachelors and masters degree from Purdue University before starting medical school at the Chicago College of Osteopathic Medicine at Midwestern University. While at CCOM, he held positions as Class President, Student Council President, and Chairman of the National Council of Student Council Presidents. He served as a delegate to the AOA House of Delegates and was twice awarded the CCOM Leadership Award.

He completed his osteopathic internship and residency in Internal Medicine at Ingham Regional Medical Center in Lansing. He served as Co-Chief Intern and Chief Medical Resident during his postgraduate training. He completed the MSU-COM Faculty Development Fellowship Course as well as the Clinician Educator Fellowship Program.

He joined the MSU faculty in 1999 and has presented at regional and international conferences on diabetes, hypertension, and the use of computers in medical education. He was the recipient of a major federal grant through the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) in 2003 to assist in the creation of a new division of primary care internal medicine at MSU. Dr. Mohr served as the Chief of the Division of General Internal Medicine at MSU-COM, which was created with the assistance of grant funding. He helped to establish a new multi-specialty clinic (Michigan State Adult Medicine) in conjunction with the MSU HealthTeam and was instrumental in the implementation of a system-wide electronic medical records system.

Dr. Mohr practiced as a general internal medicine physician in Lansing Michigan for nearly 10 years, seeing patients in both the inpatient and outpatient arena. He was an active member of the teaching faculty at the Ingham Regional Medical Center Internal Medicine residency and has had the pleasure of teaching countless students from MSU in the office and hospital. In 2005, Dr. Mohr established a new osteopathic internal medicine residency program at Sparrow Health System in Lansing, Michigan, where he served as the founding program director.

Dr. Mohr has been awarded the Intern Mentor of the Year award at Ingham Regional Medical Center and was honored to receive the American Osteopathic Foundation's "Emerging Leader Award" in 2004. He is the Vice-Chairman of the American College of Osteopathic Internists (ACOI) Council on Education and Evaluation and serves as a residency program accreditation inspector for the American Osteopathic Association. He represented the ACOI on the National Physician's Electronic Health Records Consortium and continues to serve on the ACOI's Clinical Practice Committee and the Information Technology Task Force.

In April 2008, Dr. Mohr moved west to assume the position of Chair of Specialty Medicine for the newly formed Rocky Vista University College of Osteopathic Medicine in Parker, Colorado. He is currently chair of the Systems Curriculum Development Committees and the Scholarship Committee. He also serves on the Curriculum Committee, the Student Progress Committee, and the Library Committee. He is the sponsor for the Student Osteopathic Internal Medicine Association. He acts as course coordinator for the Neuroscience, Integument, Endocrine, and Renal courses for first and second year medical students and is involved with the creation of 3rd and 4th year clerkships. Clinically, Dr. Mohr works as a hospitalist with the Critical Care and Pulmonary Consultants group out of Littleton Adventist and Sky Ridge Hospitals.
