First and Second Year

- Early integration of biomedical sciences into clinical medicines and osteopathic philosophy and principles
- Early hands-on clinical experience through:
 - Clinical physician shadowing
 - Standardized Patient Program
 - High-fidelity simulators
 - Outreach opportunities

Third and Fourth Year

- Training at one of five core hospitals in Denver, Colorado Springs, Pueblo, and Grand Junction
- Six months of hospital-based rotations
- Six months of outpatient clinical rotations with RVU faculty
- Rural rotations required during third year
- Four core rotations during senior year:
 - One month of emergency medicine
 - One month of intensive care/critical care
 - One month of a specialty care medicine
 - One month of a surgical specialty (Critical Care, Trauma, Orthopedics, Cardiovascular, Neurological)
- Five months of electives
- Residencies are planned to begin in 2012
